The commissioners agreed to pay Brosz Engineering to start on the preliminary plans for the North County Road project. Brosz Engineering works with District III on the writing of the grants.

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Roger Sund, Highway Superintendent, gave his report. The crews are blading and mowing roads, pulled shoulders in and reshaped the road on Project 24, graveled 1 mile on project 58, and repairing road signs. A new approach with a culvert has been requested on Project 24 for a new house and a new approach on Project 55 for field access, both meeting county guidelines. A demonstration will be held on a Bonnell 3-way pull behind drag. Wilcox made the motion, seconded by Jorgensen, to give Kevin Osborne permission to purchase the pull behind drag if needed. Roll call: All ayes. Motion carried.
